Important installation note [↑ Back to Top](#)

Please note there is an important first step after installing the Premiere theme. You need to navigate to Settings > Permalinks and click on the “Save Changes” button, even if you haven’t made any changes. This is to register the custom post types and custom taxonomy used in the Premiere theme.

Permalink Settings

Akismet is almost ready. You must [enter your Akismet API key](#) for it to work.

By default WordPress uses web URLs which have question marks and lots of numbers in them, however WordPress offers you the structure for your permalinks and archives. This can improve the aesthetics, usability, and forward-compatibility of your links. A here are some examples to get you started.

Common settings

Default `http://www.woothemes.com/demo/estate/?p=123`

Day and name `http://www.woothemes.com/demo/estate/2010/07/19/sample-post/`

Month and name `http://www.woothemes.com/demo/estate/2010/07/sample-post/`

Numeric `http://www.woothemes.com/demo/estate/archives/123`

Custom Structure `/%year%/%monthnum%/%day%/%postname%/`

Optional

If you like, you may enter custom structures for your category and tag URLs here. For example, using `topics` as your category base like `http://example.org/topics/uncategorized/`. If you leave these blank the defaults will be used.

Enable the slider under "Theme Options > Featured Video Slider".

Select the number of posts to display, the animation speed and the tag to pull video posts from.

Add videos under it's dedicated custom post type, then specify whether to show the actual video embed or an image in the slider. Also customize where the caption must appear.

This module displays by default on the home page.

It displays the latest videos, the most popular videos and the popular keywords associated with video posts.

Please note this module only looks for video posts, not blog posts or pages.

The most popular videos is defined by the video posts with the most comments. The popular keywords shows video post keywords.

The Premiere home page explained.

The Premiere home page is very flexible with a featured slider that can easily be disabled (more information in the next “How To” section) in the theme options. The top navigation menu can be enabled or disabled with any navigation items allowed in either navigation bar via the “Appearance > Menus” WordPress functionality.

The home page of Premiere has 4 widgetized regions available for placement of custom wo widgets in the footer. Place widgets in this region under “Appearance > Widgets”, follow the documentation on placing widgets below under the corresponding documentation.

Adding a video post [↑ Back to Top](#)

The Premiere theme uses a custom post type called “Video” to store all the video content. Adding a video post follows a similar structure to adding a blog post. More detail below:


1. Add a new video item in WordPress (Videos -> Add New)
2. Add a title to the video item
3. Add/assign a category to the video item (e.g. In the demo we have categories like Films, Music, Sport, etc.)
4. Add a tag to the post to further categorize it. Also an important step if you wish a video to appear in the slider (more information in the following “How To” section).
5. Add some text in the content to describe the video item
6. Add the video embed code in the “Premiere” Custom Settings area
7. Upload the video image in the “Premiere” Custom Settings area.
Please note: The Premiere theme will automatically look for the video thumbnail image associated to it if you are using an embed code from YouTube or Vimeo.
8. Specify the slider output (if this video is going to appear in the home page featured slider), i.e. whether you want it to display the video, or the image you specified in step. 7.
9. Choose the layout of the video post page, i.e. if it must have a sidebar on the left or right, or none at all.
10. Choose the caption position in the slide (if this video is going to appear in the home page featured slider).
11. Publish the video item and repeat for next video item

Setting up the video featured slider [↑ Back to Top](#)


The unique home page featured slider can be used to display noteworthy video posts – this is because it is tag based. Once you have specified the tag it must loop through to display it's corresponding videos, make sure you add that tag to the video posts you want to feature. It will display the title of the post, the excerpt, and the optional custom image which is the focal point of the panel. Please note you can choose individually in each video post whether to display the image or the video itself in each slide in the featured video slider.

Adding a video to the featured slider

As mentioned above once you've added your video posts to your WordPress site you can ensure specific ones appear in the featured slider on the home page. This is done by adding the assigned tag you specified in the theme options above (in the demo we created a tag called "featured". to the video post itself.

The theme includes 8 custom widgets that you can add to any of your 5 widgetized regions – 1 sidebar (Primary) and 4 footer widgetized regions.

The custom woo widgets included are:

- Woo – Flickr
- Woo – Blog Author Info
- Woo – Embed/Video
- Woo – Subscribe/Connect
